



As I See It

The Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute marked its third anniversary with a piece in last week's New England Journal, PCORI at 3 Years: Progress, Lessons and Plans. The publication coincides with major funding announcements representing a significant increase in funds for comparative effectiveness research (CER) through targeted mechanisms and large pragmatic studies. PCORI reports that nearly two-thirds of its roughly \$500 million in funding commitments to date have supported CER.

AAMC Joins IOM Discussion on Sharing of Clinical Trial Data

February 7, 2013—The Institute of Medicine (IOM) Feb. 3-5 convened a workshop on the responsible sharing of research data from clinical trials. As part of the workshop, AAMC Chief Scientific Officer Ann Bonham, Ph.D., participated on a Feb. 4 expert panel discussing the cultural and financial incentives for data sharing.

In her remarks, Dr. Bonham noted increasing support for data sharing within the academic community as a means to expand scientific opportunity to ensure that data and other resources are maximally used to promote discovery and increase collaboration. She expressed optimism that such sharing will increasingly be seen as an added dimension to scientific rigor in health research, on par with improved statistical analyses and other changes that have occurred over recent decades.

AAMC Urges Congress to Restore NIH and Health Professions Funding

Washington, D.C., December 18, 2013—AAMC (Association of American Medical Colleges) President and CEO Darrell G. Kirch, M.D., issued the following statement after the Senate passed the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2013 and the Pathway for SGR Reform Act of 2013 amendment:

*Now that Congress has taken the important step to pass the Bipartisan Budget Act, we urge lawmakers to use the appropriations process to restore funding to medical research supported by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and health professions training.

While the nation's medical schools and teaching hospitals are encouraged by the prospect of restoring funding for these vital health investments, we remain disappointed that this budget proposal leaves the sequestration cuts to Medicare in place, and extends them for two years.

Congressional Briefing Highlights Value of AHRQ Research

January 31, 2014—AAMC joined AcademyHealth and the Friends of AHRQ in hosting a Jan. 29 congressional briefing describing how research and resources supported by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) have helped to strengthen the health care system.

Panelists described how the research, datasets, and tools supported by AHRQ are used by a wide range of stakeholders — including patients, health care providers, hospitals and health systems, policymakers, and pavers — to make health care safer, more accessible, and more affordable.
